

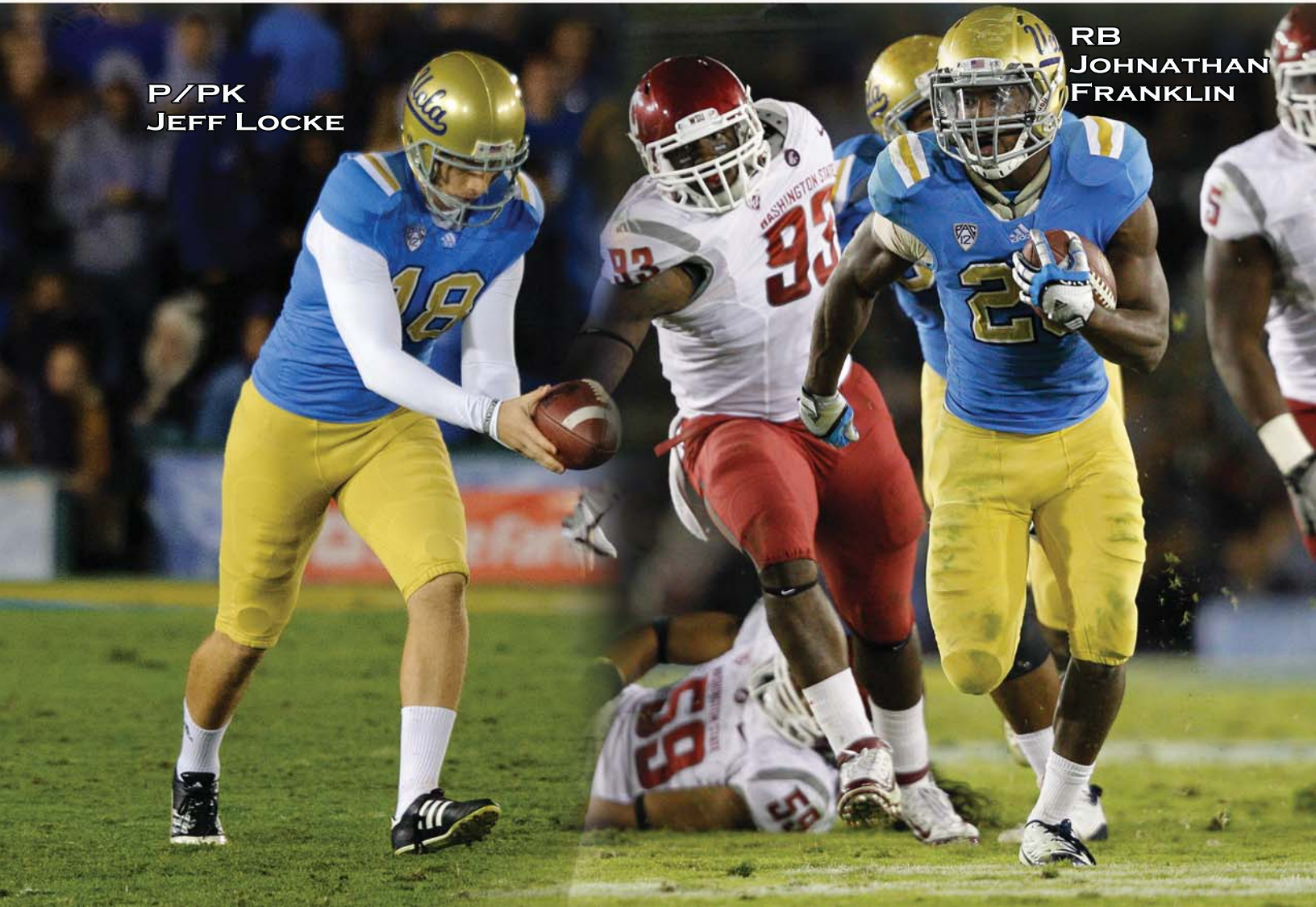

2012 UCLA Spring Outlook

BRUINS TAKE FIELD FOR FIRST TIME UNDER COACH MORA

The Bruins begin Spring practice on April 3, taking to the field for the first time under the direction of head coach Jim Mora. It is a time for new beginnings as the practice sessions will afford the coaching staff the opportunity to install, implement and evaluate as UCLA points towards the 2012 season-opener at Rice.

Coach Mora, former head coach of the Seattle Seahawks and the Atlanta Falcons, has brought in veteran offensive coordinator Noel Mazzone to run the offense and long-time NFL coach Lou Spanos to coordinate the defense. Former NFL players make up the majority of the new coaching staff with Jeff Ulbrich serving as special teams coordinator and linebackers coach; Eric Yarber mentoring the wide receivers; Adrian Klemm working as offensive line coach and running game coordinator; Steve Broussard as running backs coach; Marques Tuiasosopo guiding the tight ends; passing game coordinator Demetrice Martin will head up the Bruin secondary. Angus McClure, in his sixth season at UCLA, returns to tutor the defensive lineman.

Fifty letterwinners return to action for the Bruins, 34 have starting experience under their belts and 16 started in the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl. UCLA also welcomes back 2009 starting left tackle Xavier Su'a-Filo, following the completion of his two-year church mission. Three members of the new coaching staff's highly regarded first recruiting class -- quarterback T.J. Millweard (MILL-word), defensive back Marcus Rios, and junior college transfer offensive lineman Alexandru Ceachir (CHEECH-her) will join the Bruins for Spring Ball. In addition, North Carolina transfer defensive lineman Brandon Willis is ready for action.

The Bruins welcome back seven players who started the bulk of the games at their defensive positions in 2011: DL Datone Jones, DL Damien Holmes (now OLB), DL Cassius Marsh, LB Patrick Larimore, CB Aaron Hester, CB Sheldon Price, S Tevin McDonald. The top seven tacklers on the 2011 defense return, as do five of the top six tacklers for loss leaders and four of the top five ranking players with interceptions.

In terms of overall starting experience, the UCLA defense returns four linemen, Datone Jones 29/14 (career/2011 starts), Cassius Marsh 12/8, Owamagbe Odighizuwa 7/1, Donovan Carter 1/1; five linebackers, Patrick Larimore 20/13, Damien Holmes (20/14), Jordan Zumwalt 8/4, Keenan Graham (7/1), Eric Kendricks (3/3); and eight defensive backs, Aaron Hester (24/12), Sheldon Price (32/12), Andrew Abbott (13/7), Tevin McDonald (11/11), Dietrich Riley (5/5), Dalton Hilliard (5/5-moving to offense), Alex Mascarenas (2/2), Stan McKay (2/2).

The offense also returns seven players who started the majority of games at their positions in 2011: OL Jeff Baca, OL Greg Capella, OL Alberto Cid, TE Joseph Fauria, RB Johnathan Franklin, QB Kevin Prince, WR Shaq Evans. Overall, UCLA returns its top two passers, its top three total offense leaders, two of its top four receptions leaders, along with its top rusher.

The unit welcomes back seven linemen with starting experience, Jeff Baca (33/12), Greg Capella (14/14), Xavier Su'a-Filo (13/0), Alberto Cid (6/6), Chris Ward (4/4), Wade Yandall (3/3) and Brett Downey (1/1); three receivers, Shaq Evans (6/6), Ricky Marvray (4/0) and Jerry Johnson (1/0); one tight end, Joseph Fauria (9/9); two running backs, Johnathan Franklin (32/14) and Jordan James (3/3); two quarterbacks, Kevin Prince (26/10) and Richard Brehaut (11/4).

Franklin (2,669 yards) is ninth on all-time rushing list at UCLA and became the 15th

Bruin to exceed the 2,000-yard mark for a career. He enters 2011 with a shot at joining the 3,000-yard club which features Gaston Green, Freeman McNeil, DeShaun Foster, Karim Abdul-Jabbar, Wendell Tyler and Skip Hicks. The Bruins offense churned out six 200-yard plus rushing games in 2011.

Fauria was added to the Mackey Award Watch List at mid-season in 2011 and led the team with six touchdowns catches, most by a Bruin receiver since Mercedes Lewis had 10 in 2005.

On special teams, senior Jeff Locke, one of the nation's best punters, and senior long snapper Kevin McDermott return. Locke's career punting average of 44.58 ranks No. 2 in UCLA annals and his 44.34 mark in 2011 ranked 12th in the country. A career-best twenty-six of his 64 punts were downed inside the twenty-yard line last season.

The 2012 schedule starts for the second straight season in Houston, TX, this time with a date at Rice University. Nebraska, 9-4 in its first season in the Big Ten a year ago, comes to the Rose Bowl in game two. High-scoring Houston, from Conference USA, follows the Cornhuskers into Pasadena.

Five of the nine conference games will be contested in the Rose Bowl where UCLA captured all four league skirmishes a year ago. The Pac-12 slate opens with a home contest against Oregon State, before road games at Colorado and at California. Utah makes its first trip to the Rose Bowl as a member of the Pac-12 conference in game seven. After a bye week, the Bruins road trip to Arizona State before returning home to square off with Arizona. The final travel game of the season is a November 10 date at Washington State. UCLA finishes the season with a pair of home games against USC and Stanford. Three opponents on the schedule won double-digit games last season and seven went on to play in bowl games.

OFFENSE

QUARTERBACK

The Bruins return both quarterbacks who started games in 2011, Kevin Prince (10 starts) and Richard Brehaut (4 starts). Each will be looking to provide a consistent level of production and efficiency within the new system.

Redshirt senior **KEVIN PRINCE** (6-2, 230) has opened the last three seasons as the starter and owns 26 career starts. He ranks eighth on the all-time school career total offense list with almost 5,000 yards to his credit (4,975). Prince is also eighth on the all-time school career pass completions list (341) and ninth on the all-time passing yards list (4,262).

The strong-armed signal-caller opened under center in the first game last season at Houston, but was sidelined in the first half with a concussion. He returned to the lineup to start game three against Texas, but was then replaced as the starter by Richard Brehaut for games four through seven. After Brehaut was injured, Prince once again assumed the starting role and went on to establish a career high with 12 touchdown passes, while approaching the 2,000 yards passing mark. His total of 425 rushing yards were the most by a Bruin quarterback since Jeff Dankworth racked up 815 in 1976.

2012 UCLA Spring Outlook

Prince missed seven games in 2010 due to a knee injury. He threw for 2,050 yards as a freshman in 2009, a total which ranks No. 2 on UCLA's all-time freshman list. He became just the second freshman quarterback in UCLA history to pass for over 300 yards three times (311 v. Cal, 323 at Oregon St., 314 at Wash. St.) in a season (Tommy Maddox in 1990).

True senior **RICHARD BREHAUT** (6-2, 225) started four games last season and has 11 career starts under his belt. After Prince went down against Houston, he started game two versus San Jose State. Brehaut came on in relief against Texas and then replaced Prince as the starter in game four at Oregon State. He went on to start the next two contests against Stanford and Washington State. Brehaut left the game against the Cougars in the second quarter with a fractured lower left leg and saw action in only a handful of plays over the balance of the season. He tossed six touchdowns passes in 2011 and had a two-season, 141-pass attempts streak without an interception snapped in the Pac-12 Championship game at Oregon.

Brehaut started seven games and played in nine contests overall in 2010. He completed 119 of 212 pass attempts with six touchdowns and seven interceptions. He entered UCLA for the 2009 Spring Quarter and went on to see action in six games off the bench that season, completing 11 of 17 passing attempts for 124 yards, no touchdowns and one interception.

Redshirt freshman **BRETT HUNDLEY** (6-4, 225), entered UCLA in January, 2011 after playing in the Under Armour Prep All-Star game and will be taking part in his second spring practice. In his senior season at Chandler, AZ High School, he completed 139 of 225 passes for 2,348 yards and 20 touchdowns, with only two interceptions. In addition, he rushed for 856 yards and nine touchdowns and was rated among the top three prep prospects nationally by at least one organization.

A trio of true freshmen --- **JERRY NEUHEISEL** (6-2, 190) from Los Angeles Loyola HS, **T.J. MILLWEARD** (6-4, 230) from All Saints HS in Fort Worth, TX and walkon **MIKE FAFAUL** (6-3, 215) from Fork Union Military Academy, in Virginia, will look to catch the eye of the new coaching staff.

RUNNING BACK

The running back position is headlined by redshirt senior Johnathan Franklin who has amassed over 2,000 yards rushing in the past two seasons and worked his way up to the number nine spot on the all-time school list.

FRANKLIN (5-10, 205), an honorable mention All-Pac-12 selection in 2011, came up just short in his bid for a second-straight 1,000-yard rushing season. His 976 yards, on 166 carries, moved him to ninth on the all-time UCLA rushing list. Franklin averaged a career-best 5.9 yards per carry in 2011. He had three 100-yard games on the year, capped off by a 162-yard effort against Colorado, the 10th career time he has met or exceeded the century mark.

In 2010, Franklin led the Bruins in rushing with 1,127 yards, the 10th-best season mark in school history and a total which almost doubled his output as a freshman. Franklin became UCLA's first 1,000-yard rusher since 2006 (Chris Markey) and posted the highest Bruin rushing total since Skip Hicks ran for 1,282 yards in 1997.

True junior **MALCOLM JONES** (6-0, 227) appeared in 12 games in 2011 as a reserve running back and on special teams. Jones carried 25 times for 103 yards on the year and scored his first career touchdown against Colorado on a one-yard run. He was named to the first-team Pac-12 All-Academic football squad. In 2010, he saw action in 11 games off the bench and rushed for 200 yards. His best effort came in a 52-yard game against Stanford.

Redshirt sophomore **JORDON JAMES** (5-11, 200) saw action in all 14 games in 2011 at the f-back position and on special teams, making three starts. He carried the ball 20 times for 54 yards and scored a touchdown at Oregon State. James also caught seven balls for 122 yards. In 2010, he battled injuries early in the season and ended up utilizing a redshirt season.

True senior **DALTON HILLIARD** (6-0, 205) will move to running back, a position he excelled at in high school. Hilliard saw action in 14 games last season, with five

starts at safety. He was sixth on the team in tackles with 50, one for loss.

Redshirt freshman **STEVEN MANFRO** (5-11, 195) was named the winner of the Charles Pike Memorial Award for Offensive Scout Team Player of the Year in 2011. Manfro runs well, can catch the ball out of the backfield and could be a candidate for special teams return duty.

Walkon redshirt freshman **MELVIN EMESIBE** (5-11, 200) will add depth at the position.

FULLBACK

Redshirt senior **DAVID ALLEN** (6-2, 224) has switched over to the offensive side of the ball (from linebacker) and will be at fullback. A member of most of the Bruin special teams units, Allen will look to make an impression at his new position.

Walkon redshirt sophomores **PHILLIP RUHL** (6-0, 225), **LUKE GANE** (6-1, 247) and **ALEK CUSICK** (6-1, 235) are also in the equation at fullback. Ruhl, a linebacker in 2011, saw action on special teams, while Gane worked at tight end and f-back last season. Cusick did not see game action.

WIDE RECEIVER

Redshirt junior **SHAQ EVANS** (6-1, 205) appeared in 13 games in 2011 and made six starts. He ranked fourth on the team with 19 catches for 309 yards and a couple of touchdowns. A transfer from Notre Dame, who sat out the 2010 season, Evans made three receptions for the Irish as a true freshman in 2009.

Redshirt junior **RICKY MARVRAY** (6-0, 190) saw action in 13 games off the bench last season and made 10 catches for 57 yards. He appeared in 11 games in 2010, made four starts, and ranked third on the team with 20 catches.

Redshirt senior **JERRY JOHNSON** (6-4, 218) saw limited action in 2011 while coming back from an ankle injury. In 2010, he saw action in eight games and made five catches for 57 yards. Johnson fractured his left ankle in his first career start against Arizona and missed the last four games of the 2010 season.

Speedy redshirt junior **DAMIEN THIGPEN** (5-9, 185) sat out the 2011 season due to leg injuries. He worked as an f-back and running back in previous seasons and will be at receiver this season. He saw action in eight games in 2010 and made one rushing attempt for 22 yards, caught one pass for nine yards and returned nine kickoffs for a 21.3 yards average. He also recorded five tackles while on special teams.

Redshirt junior walkon **JERRY RICE, JR.** (6-0, 182) saw action in two games in 2011 and hauled in his first career receptions. Both grabs came against California and went for a total of 17 yards.

Redshirt freshman **DEVIN LUCIEN** (6-1, 192) impressed the coaches in practices last season. This Spring, he will have the opportunity to show how that experience has paid off as he bids to join the receiver rotation. As a prep senior at Crespi HS in 2010, he made 71 catches for 1,259 yards and 18 touchdowns.

Redshirt freshmen **TYLER SCOTT** (6-2, 214), **ROOSEVELT DAVIS** (5-7, 162), **CHRISTOPH BONO** (6-1, 162) and **LOGAN SWEET** (6-1, 185) and true frosh **SAM HANDLER** (6-0, 200) will also compete at this position.

Y POSITION

Redshirt senior Joseph Fauria is the one experienced returner at the y/tight end position. Fauria has led the team or had a share of the team lead in touchdown receptions in each of the past two seasons.

FAURIA (6-7, 258) appeared in 14 games with nine starts in 2011. He led the team with six touchdown receptions, while his 39 receptions and 481 receiving yards ranked second on the squad. In 2010, Fauria made three catches, for a total of 21 yards and two touchdowns. He joined the Bruins in the Fall of 2009 after transferring from Notre Dame, where he played in three games as a freshman in 2008.

Redshirt junior **DARIUS BELL** (6-0, 230) is making the switch to the y receiver

this Spring. He did not see game action in 2011. Bell played in one contest in 2010, at quarterback, after transferring in from City College of San Francisco in time for Fall Practices.

Redshirt sophomore **JOHNYOUNG** (6-5, 280), from Loyola HS, will look to make an impact after battling injuries throughout his first two seasons in the program.

Walkon redshirt junior **JORDAN BARRETT** (6-3, 257) saw limited action in 2011, primarily on special teams. A transfer from UNLV, Barrett sat out the 2010 season to comply with NCAA rules.

OFFENSIVE TACKLE

The offensive line welcomes back three starting players in Jeff Baca, Greg Capella and Alberto Cid. Others with starting experience include sophomore tackle Xavier Su'a-Filo, who started 13 games at left tackle in 2009 and has returned from a two-year church mission, and redshirt senior Brett Downey, who started the bowl game against Illinois. UCLA churned out six 200-yard plus rushing games in 2011.

Redshirt senior **BRETT DOWNEY** (6-7, 305), who earned a scholarship last season, made his first career start against Illinois. He had seen his first game action in a 2009 contest at Washington State.

Sophomore **XAVIER SU'A-FILO** (6-4, 310) started 13 games at left tackle in the 2009 season. He became the first Bruin true freshman ever to start a season opener on the offensive side of the ball and went on to earn honorable mention All-Pac-10 honors.

Sophomore **ALEXANDRU CEACHIR** (6-5, 305) was ranked No. 49 on the SuperPrep JUCO 100 list. He played mostly left tackle last season for Santa Monica College. Ceachir came to the U.S. from Russia in 2009.

Redshirt senior **CONNOR BRADFORD** (6-5, 278) will offer depth as will redshirt freshmen **WILL OLIVER** (6-7, 300), **TORIAN WHITE** (6-6, 295), and walkon **MICHAEL PADOVESE** (6-5, 322).

OFFENSIVE GUARD

Redshirt senior **JEFF BACA** (6-4, 305) moves back to guard this spring, a position at which he started 13 games (left guard) in 2009. He saw his first action of 2011 with a start at tackle in game two against San Jose State. He was in the starting lineup at tackle for the next 11 contests before sliding in to guard in the bowl game against Illinois.

True junior guard **CHRIS WARD** (6-4, 318) saw his 2011 season end early after he underwent left knee surgery on Dec. 13. He started at guard in the first two games of the campaign and in battles at Oregon State and at Stanford. He made his first career start in the season-opener at Houston.

Redshirt junior **ALBERTO CID** (6-4, 305) transferred into UCLA in the fall of 2011. He started games at guard against San Jose State, Washington State, Arizona, Colorado, USC and Oregon.

Redshirt sophomore **WADE YANDALL** (6-4, 315) started three games at guard in 2011. He made his first career start against Cal as the Bruins rushed for 294 yards. Yandall also started against Arizona State, a game which saw UCLA rack up 220 yards on the ground. His third start came at Utah.

Redshirt junior **CASEY GRIFFITHS** (6-5, 292), redshirt sophomore walkon **SAM SAULTZ** (6-2, 315) and redshirt freshman **BEN WYSOCKI** (6-4, 300) will look to impress.

CENTER

Redshirt junior **GREG CAPELLA** (6-4, 310) started all 14 games in 2011. He lined up at guard for 13 games and started at center against San Jose State. Capella made his first career start in the season-opener at Houston.

Redshirt sophomore **KODY INNES** (6-4, 285) worked mostly with the scout team last season and redshirt freshman **JAKE BRENDEL** (6-5, 292) played with the No. 2 offense for much of the 2011 season.

DEFENSE

UCLA returns seven starters on this side of the ball, plus many talented youngsters who will compete for playing time and starting jobs during spring practice.

DEFENSIVE END

Redshirt senior end **DATONE JONES** (6-5, 280) started all 14 games in 2011. He led the Bruin linemen with 41 tackles and also topped the team with 6.5 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks. He matched his personal best with six tackles against Cal, including a new high of two sacks.

Junior **CASSIUS MARSH** (6-4, 295) appeared in 12 games in 2011, with eight

starting assignments. He tied for second on the team with 2.0 sacks last season.

True junior end **OWAMAGBE ODIGHIZUWA** (6-5, 278) saw action in all 14 games in 2011 and made one start (Oregon). He matched his career high with four tackles against Texas. Redshirt junior end **IUTA TEPA** (6-2, 268) saw action off the bench in 13 games in 2011 and tied for fourth on the team with 4.5 tackles for loss.

Redshirt sophomore **BRANDON WILLIS** (6-3, 275) is an exciting prospect who worked on the Bruin scout team last season after transferring in from the University of North Carolina.

Redshirt sophomore **TRE HALE** (6-2, 308) saw action on some special teams last season. Redshirt freshman **SAM TAI** (6-4, 275) enrolled at UCLA in January, 2011 and will be taking part in his second spring practice.

NOSE TACKLE

Redshirt senior **DONOVAN CARTER** (6-2, 313) played in all 14 games last season. He made his first career start against Washington State and registered a personal-best six tackles. He had 36 stops on the year to rank second among the defensive linemen.

True junior tackle **SEALI' I EPEUSA** (6-2, 323) has seen action in 15 games the past two seasons. He made seven stops, one for loss, last season in eight contests. Redshirt freshmen **KEVIN McREYNOLDS** (6-3, 310) and **BRANDON TULIAUPUPU** (6-2, 331) will take part in their first spring practices.

OUTSIDE LINEBACKER

Redshirt senior end **DAMIEN HOLMES** (6-4, 260) started all 14 games along the defensive line last season and will now learn the outside linebacker spot in the new defense. He tied for second on the team with 6.0 tackles for loss.

Like Holmes, redshirt junior end **KEENAN GRAHAM** (6-3, 252) will make the switch to outside linebacker from down lineman. Graham saw action in all 14 games and made 20 stops last season, 2.5 for loss.

True junior **JORDAN ZUMWALT** (6-4, 235) saw action in 13 games and made four starts in 2011. He ranked third on the team in tackles (60) and tied for second with 6.0 tackles for loss. Zumwalt recorded a career-best 10 tackles and picked off his first pass in the bowl game against Illinois.

True junior **ANTHONY BARR** (6-4, 238) is a fine all-around athlete who made seven starts at f-back in 2011. He will switch over to defense as the coaches look to determine the position at which he can make the most impact.

True sophomore **AARON WALLACE** (6-4, 235) enrolled early a year ago from Rancho Bernardo HS in San Diego and will be taking part in his second spring practice. Redshirt sophomore **RYAN HOFMEISTER** (6-2, 220), who played in the 2010 season at Riverside City College, looks to become a contributor after sitting out last season.

INSIDE LINEBACKER

Redshirt senior **PATRICK LARIMORE** (6-3, 253) started 13 games in 2011 and topped the team in tackles with 81. His 6.2 tackles average per game ranked 17th in the Pac-12. In the Pac-12 Championship Game, he made six stops, recovered a fumble and returned an interception for a touchdown.

Redshirt junior **ISAIAH BOWENS** (6-2, 235) will look to find a niche in the new defense. He saw action in 12 games last season and made nine tackles.

Redshirt junior **TODD GOLPER** (6-1, 240) saw his first game action in the 2011 season, appearing in a total of 12 games at linebacker and on special teams.

Redshirt sophomore **ERIC KENDRICKS** (6-2, 230) appeared in 14 games last season, earning the starting nod in the final three contests. He was second on the club in tackles and ranked tied for fourth in tackles for loss (4.5). Kendrick was named an honorable mention Freshman All-American by collegefootballnews.com. He tied for the team lead with a career-high 10 stops in the bowl game against Illinois.

Redshirt sophomore **ARAMIDE OLANIYAN** (6-2, 220) saw his first game action last season and made two tackles, one for loss, while appearing in 13 contests. Likewise, for redshirt senior walkon **RYAN MEDINA** (6-3, 235) who saw his first career game action, on special teams, in 2011.

Redshirt freshmen **MIKE ORLOFF** (6-3, 215) and **JASON STEWART** (6-2, 237) add depth to the position.

DEFENSIVE CORNERS

The Bruins return their top two cornerbacks from a year ago in Aaron Hester and Sheldon Price, who have a combined total of 56 starting assignments between them.

2012 UCLA Spring Outlook

Redshirt senior **AARON HESTER** (6-1, 205) saw action in all 14 games last year, and made 12 starts. He ranked fourth on the squad with 57 tackles, including a career-best 11 stops at Oregon State. He had an interception against Cal.

True senior **SHELDON PRICE** (6-2, 185) appeared in 12 games last season, all starts. He ranked tied for 17th in the Pac-12 in passes defended (0.67) and led the team with two forced fumbles. He tied for the team lead with eight tackles at USC and made his first career interception against San Jose State.

Redshirt junior **BRANDON SERMONS** (6-0, 185) saw action in 12 games in 2011 and was credited with five tackles. He sat out the 2010 season to recover from a leg injury he suffered during 2010 spring practice after appearing in nine games in 2009, mostly on special teams. Redshirt sophomore **ANTHONY JEFFERSON** (6-1, 190) from Los Angeles, CA is an excellent athlete who has battled injuries throughout his time in Westwood and will look to make an impression this Spring.

Redshirt sophomore **LIBRADO BAROCIO** (5-9, 175), a non-scholarship performer, will add depth at cornerback after appearing in five games in 2011. Redshirt freshman **ERICK ZUMWALT** (5-10, 170) is taking part in his initial spring practice.

True freshman **MARCUS RIOS** (6-0, 185) has enrolled early at UCLA. He was listed as a four-star recruit out of Cosumnes Oaks HS in Elk Grove, CA. In his senior season, Rios totaled 59 tackles, four interceptions and 16 passes defended.

DEFENSIVE SAFETIES

Redshirt senior **ANDREW ABBOTT** (5-11, 200) will move to safety after playing corner the previous three seasons. He saw action in 13 games in 2011, working as the nickel back and at cornerback, totaling seven starts. He ranked tied for fourth in the Pac-12 in interceptions (0.31) and received honorable mention all-conference honors. Abbott picked off two passes against Colorado and also had thefts at Arizona and against Washington State. He was awarded a scholarship prior to the 2010 season.

Redshirt sophomore safety **TEVIN McDONALD** (6-0, 202) appeared in 14 games and earned the starting nod in the last 11 contests. He ranked tied for ninth in the Pac-12 in passes defended (0.86) and led the team with nine pass defenses. McDonald was named Freshman All-American by Yahoo! Sports and cbssports.com. He posted a career-best 11 tackles against Arizona State and tied the school record with three interceptions in the Cal game.

Redshirt junior safety **STAN MCKAY** (6-1, 205) appeared in all 13 games and made two starts in 2011. He registered 32 tackles on the year.

True junior safety **DIETRICH RILEY** (6-1, 205) saw action in eight games, with five starts, in 2011. He recorded 36 tackles, but was sidelined by a neck injury in the Cal game and sat out the rest of the year. He will not participate in Spring practice.

Redshirt junior safety **ALEX MASCARENAS** (5-10, 188) saw action in four games and made two starts in 2011. He was sent to the sidelines with a head injury which forced him to miss the balance of the season.

Redshirt sophomore **JARED KOSTER** (6-1, 208) is another player who has battled injuries during his career. He will make the move from linebacker to safety this Spring.

Redshirt freshman **ANTHONY THOMPSON** (6-1, 208) will look to impress the new staff, along with redshirt sophomore walkon **DYLAN PRICE** (5-10, 206).

SPECIALISTS

This group is headed by redshirt senior punter **JEFF LOCKE** (6-1, 214) who continues to establish himself as one of the nation's best. He ranked 12th in the country with a 44.34 average in 2011 and placed 26 kicks inside the twenty-yard line. Locke has also handled the kickoff duties the past three seasons.

Redshirt sophomore placekicker **JOE ROBERTS** (6-1, 206) will get a long look in the spring sessions as will redshirt freshman punter **MICHAEL LEAMY** (5-11, 183).

Redshirt senior **KEVIN McDERMOTT** (6-5, 247) performed well in his first year as the team's long snapper. Waiting in reserve, are a threesome of redshirt freshmen --- **PETER HAJIMIHALIS** (5-9, 195), **JAY WENETA** (6-0, 216) and **CHRISTOPHER LONGO** (6-4, 203).

The spring practices will be used to determine the kick returners.

Jim Mora

Head Football Coach (First Season)

Washington '84

On December 10, 2011, former NFC Coach of the Year Jim Mora was named UCLA's 17th head coach in school history. Mora comes to UCLA after spending part of 2010 and most of 2011 as a television analyst and contributor for the NFL Network and the NFL on Fox. He brings 25 years of NFL coaching acumen with him to UCLA, including four years of NFL head coaching experience while at the helm of the Atlanta Falcons (2004-06) and the Seattle Seahawks (2009).

Mora took over for Mike Holmgren as head coach of the Seattle Seahawks in 2009. He had served as assistant head coach and defensive backs coach for Seattle in the 2007 and 2008 campaigns. The Seahawks went 10-6 and finished first in the NFC West in the 2007 season and won the Wild Card game in the playoffs. In his initial season as the head coach of the Falcons in 2004, Mora guided the team to an 11-5 record, becoming just the eighth rookie head coach in NFL history to win 11 games and the 11th to bring home a Division title. Atlanta captured the NFC South title and earned an appearance in the NFC Championship game for only the second time in franchise history. Mora was selected as the NFC Coach of the Year. The Falcon's defense improved from a league ranking of 32nd in 2003 to No. 14 overall the next season, fueled by a league-leading and franchise record 48 quarterback sacks. Atlanta topped the NFL in rushing in all three of coach Mora's seasons as head coach. In 2006, Michael Vick became the first quarterback in NFL history to rush for at least 1,000 yards in a season.

Mora had joined the Falcons from the San Francisco 49ers where he spent seven seasons, from 1997-2003, including the last five as the defensive coordinator. In his first year, the 49ers finished No. 1 in the NFL in total defense, No. 2 in pass defense (with 25 interceptions), takeaways (41) and run defense, as well as No. 3 in the League in sacks (with 54). The 1998 squad tied for No. 1 in the NFC, and No. 4 in the NFL, with 21 interceptions. In the 2002 and 2003 seasons with San Francisco, the defense finished no worse than fourth in the NFL versus the run and in 2003, produced 42 sacks to tie for second in the conference. The 1997 team advanced to the NFC Championship Game and had three defensive players voted to the Pro Bowl, while the 1998 and 2002 squads captured Wild Card Game wins.

Mora worked the previous five seasons (1992-1996) on the staff of his dad, Jim E. Mora, as the secondary coach with the New Orleans Saints. His defensive expertise began to take shape and the Saints boasted the No. 1 pass defense in the NFL during his first two years. In 1985, Mora broke into the NFL coaching ranks with the San Diego Chargers under head coach Don Coryell. He spent seven seasons with the Chargers, advancing from the league's first quality control coach position to defensive backs coach, while working for head coaches Coryell, Al Saunders and Dan Henning.

Mora began his coaching career in 1984 at the University of Washington. He joined the staff of head coach Don James in the role of defensive assistant following a four-year playing career as a defensive back for the Huskies. While at UW, Mora had the opportunity to be a part of two Rose Bowl teams (1981-loss to Michigan and 1982-win over Iowa) as a player, in addition to helping the Huskies land a berth in the 1985 Orange Bowl (win over Oklahoma) as a graduate assistant. During his five seasons in the Husky program, Washington compiled a 48-12 record, ranked among the nation's top 10 teams on three occasions, and did not finish lower than second in the Pac-10 standings.

NFL Pro Bowlers who have played under coach Mora over the years include -- Julian Peterson, LB Seattle and San Francisco; Marcus Trufant, DB Seattle; Allen Rossum, DB Atlanta; Patrick Kerney, DL Atlanta; Roderick Coleman, DL Atlanta; Keith Brooking, LB Atlanta; DeAngelo Hall, DB Atlanta; Michael Vick, QB Atlanta; Alge Crumpler, TE Atlanta; Warrick Dunn, RB Atlanta; Bryant Young, DL San Francisco; Lance Schulters, DB San Francisco; Merton Hanks, DB San Francisco; Eric Allen, DB New Orleans; Tyrone Hughes, DB New Orleans; Gill Byrd, DB San Diego Chargers.

Outside of his role as a coach and then broadcaster, Mora and his wife, Shannon, founded the Jim Mora Count on Me Foundation in 2005 which strives to support children in need by affording them the opportunity to realize their potential and dreams, help create more stability in their lives, support advocacy for children, and support channels that allow children to have a voice.

Noel Mazzone (New Mexico '80) - Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks

Noel Mazzone (Muh-ZONE-ee) joined the Bruin staff in January of 2012. He had served as offensive coordinator at Arizona State the previous two seasons under then head coach Dennis Erickson.

The Sun Devils offense ranked 25th in the nation in 2011 (445.8 yds per game), 10th in passing offense (316.7 yds per game) and 28th in scoring offense (33.2 pts). Quarterback Brock Osweiler ranked 11th in the NCAA in total offense (317.4). Running back Cameron Marshall recorded 18 rushing touchdowns and ranked seventh in the Pac-12 in average yards per game (80.8). In 2010, ASU was listed as the No. 15 passing offense in the nation and the No. 29 total offense in the country. In addition, ASU rushed for 19 touchdowns.

Mazzone came to Arizona State from the NFL, after having served as the wide receivers coach on Eric Mangini's staff at the New York Jets from 2006-2008 and then working as a personnel consultant for the Jets in 2009. While with the Jets, he coached wideouts Jericho Cotchery and Laveranues Coles, who set a franchise record for combined yardage and receptions.

Before his time in the professional ranks, Mazzone coached in college football for more than two decades. He has tutored quarterbacks, running backs, receivers and tight ends, while also serving as offensive coordinator at three schools (Ole Miss, Auburn and North Carolina State).

In 2005, Mazzone served a second stint at Ole Miss as the offensive coordinator before heading off to the NFL. From 2003-2004, he was the offensive coordinator and tight ends coach at North Carolina State. At State, he coached All-American quarterback Philip Rivers (currently a Pro Bowler with the San Diego Chargers), who went on to become the fourth overall pick in the 2004 NFL Draft, and Cotchery a wide receiver. The Wolfpack offense led the ACC in six offensive categories and topped the NCAA in pass efficiency. It ranked third in the NCAA in passing offense and was No. 8 in scoring offense.

In 2002, he was on Erickson's Oregon State staff as the running backs and special teams coach. While with the Beavers, he coached Steven Jackson, now an All-Pro running back with the St. Louis Rams.

Mazzone worked as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 1999-2001 on Tommy Tuberville's staff at Auburn. He recruited and coached the 2000 SEC Player of the Year, Rudi Johnson, a future Pro Bowler with the Cincinnati Bengals. Mazzone also tutored All-SEC quarterback Ben Leard, who set an NCAA record in pass efficiency, current NFL quarterback Jason Campbell, St. Louis Rams running back Carnell Williams and Philadelphia Eagles running back Ronnie Brown. Auburn won the SEC West Championship under his watch (2000-01) and set the Citrus Bowl passing record.

From 1994-98, he was on Tuberville's staff at Ole Miss as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach. Ole Miss won the 1997 Motor City Bowl and produced the school's first 1,000-yard rusher, since 1950, in Deuce McAllister who would later star for the New Orleans Saints. Mazzone also coached quarterback Stu Patridge, who set an NCAA record in passing efficiency and a school record with 200 straight passes without an interception.

Mazzone was the quarterbacks coach at the University of Minnesota from 1992-94 and at TCU from 1987-91. At Texas Christian, quarterback Matt Vogler set a then NCAA single-game passing record with 690 yards, completing 44 passes, against Houston. The first stop on Mazzone's collegiate coaching journey was a five-year stint at Colorado State working with the Rams quarterbacks and receivers. He mentored signal-caller Kelly Stouffer, who was the sixth overall selection in the 1986 NFL Draft by the Seattle Seahawks.

Mazzone began his coaching career, in 1980-81 as a graduate assistant coach at the University of New Mexico. He was also an assistant coach at Boulder, CO High School in 1981.

A native of Raton, New Mexico, Mazzone graduated from the University of New Mexico in 1980. He also played quarterback for the Lobos, leading the team in passing in 1976 and 1977.

Lou Spanos (Tulsa '94) - Defensive Coordinator

Lou Spanos was named UCLA's defensive coordinator in January of 2012. He joined the Bruin staff after serving as an NFL assistant coach for the last 17 years. Spanos has worked for three NFL head coaches who have won Super Bowls. He also has labored alongside such notable NFL defensive coordinators as Dick LeBeau and Jim Haslett.

In the 2011 and 2010 seasons, Spanos was the linebackers coach of the Washington Redskins on the staff of head coach Mike Shanahan, who had guided the Denver Broncos to Super Bowl wins in 1997 and 1998. He was instrumental in helping Haslett, the new Redskins defensive coordinator, install the defensive system. Washington's second team All-Pro linebacker London Fletcher, who played in the 2010 Pro Bowl, led the NFL in tackles with 166 in the 2011 campaign and was added to the Pro Bowl roster. In addition, Spanos tutored linebackers Brian Orakpo, also a Pro Bowler, and Ryan Kerrigan, the NFL Rookie of the Month for September 2011, in their transition to the new defense.

The previous 15 seasons, Spanos was a defensive assistant with the Pittsburgh Steelers, working under head coaches Bill Cowher and Mike Tomlin, each former NFL defensive coordinators, and each winners of the Super Bowl (Cowher-2005, Tomlin-2009). While in Pittsburgh, he worked closely with the linebackers and the secondary. Spanos was one of only three assistants on the Steeler's staff to be with the team for its Super Bowl XXX (lost to Dallas), Super Bowl XL (win over Seattle) and Super Bowl XLIII (win over Arizona) appearances. During his years in Pittsburgh, the Steelers defense ranked among the top 10 in the NFL 13 times, including four No. 1 rankings. Pittsburgh managed to win at least 10 games in 10 of those seasons.

Spanos helped coach nine different Steeler linebackers who combined for 19 Pro Bowl appearances - Kevin Greene (2), Greg Lloyd (2), Chad Brown (1), Levon Kirkland (2), Jason Gildon (3), Kendrell Bell (1), Joey Porter (3), James Farrior (2) and James Harrison (3). In addition, Harrison earned the Associated Press NFL Defensive Player of the Year Award in 2008, while Bell was the 2001 Associated Press Defensive Rookie of the Year.

Spanos originally joined the Steelers in 1994 as an intern in the scouting department before being promoted to a defensive assistant after one season. A 1994 graduate of the University of Tulsa, Spanos was a four-year letterman and starter at center. The 1989 and 1991 Golden Hurricane squads played in bowl games. In 1991, Tulsa beat San Diego State in the Freedom Bowl, to finish with a 10-2 record, and was ranked 21st on the final Associated Press poll. After his playing career ended (1989-92), Spanos remained at Tulsa as a student assistant working with the linebackers.

Steve Broussard (Washington State '90) - Running Backs

Former Washington State University star and first-round NFL draft pick Steve Broussard joined the staff at UCLA in December of 2011 after serving two seasons as wide receivers coach for Arizona State.

In 2011, ASU ranked 10th in the nation in passing offense (316.7 yds/g) and receiver Gerell Robinson ranked ninth in the nation with 107.5 receiving yards per game. During the 2010 season, Broussard's receiving corps ranked 15th in the nation (286.4) and totaled 279 receptions for 3,437 yards and 23 touchdowns.

Broussard came to Arizona State after having served as the running backs and special teams coach at his alma mater, Washington State University, from 2007-2009. Prior to that, Broussard coached running backs and wide receivers at Portland State University from 2004-2006. During the 2004 season, the team led the Big Sky conference in rushing, averaging 204.4 yards per game. Previously, he served as the offensive coordinator for Diamond Ranch High School in 2001, before being named head coach in 2002. He began his coaching career at Don Lugo High School in Chino, CA as the offensive coordinator in 2000.

Prior to setting out on his coaching career, Broussard played both college and professional football. Starting his professional career with the Atlanta Falcons (1990-93), Broussard rushed for 1,472 yards, caught 48 passes and scored 12 touchdowns in four years. His best season with the Falcons was his rookie year when he

rushed for 454 yards and scored four touchdowns. Broussard joined the Cincinnati Bengals for one year (1994) and rushed for 403 yards and caught 43 passes. In 1995, Broussard became a Seattle Seahawk for his final four seasons in the NFL. His best year with the Seahawks was in 1997, when he gained 418 yards and caught 24 passes. Spending a total of nine years in the NFL, Broussard finished his career with 578 rushing attempts for 2,625 yards; 126 receptions for 882 yards; and 22 touchdowns, rushing and receiving combined.

As a collegiate performer at Washington State, Broussard was named to the Pacific-10 Conference's second-team as a running back after his sophomore season in which he led the Cougars in receiving with 59 catches for 701 yards and three touchdowns. During his junior year, he rushed for 1,280 yards, which ranked seventh nationally and first in the Pac-10. Broussard was only the second player in conference history to lead the league in receiving one year and rushing the next. Broussard completed his career third on the school's all-time rushing list with 3,054 yards and fifth in receptions with 120. He ranked seventh on the Pac-10 list with 4,635 all-purpose yards. Following his college career, Broussard was selected with the 20th overall pick by the Atlanta Falcons in the first round of the 1990 NFL Draft. He attended Manual Arts High School in Los Angeles.

Adrian Klemm (Hawai'i/ Excelsior College '08) - Running Game Coordinator/Offensive Line

Former NFL lineman and three-time Super Bowl winner Adrian Klemm joined the Bruin staff in December, 2011, after coaching four seasons at SMU. In just a few shorts weeks in Westwood, he helped the Bruins bring in one of the nation's top recruiting classes and was named Pac-12 Recruiter of the Year by 24/7 Sports. He was also tabbed by Rivals.com as one of the nation's Top 25 recruiters.

Klemm, a four-year starter at Hawai'i, began volunteering as a coach with the SMU program in 2008 after spending seven seasons in the NFL and winning three Super Bowls (XXXVI, XXXVIII, XXXIX) as a member of the New England Patriots. He made an immediate impact at SMU, quickly becoming recognized as one of the nation's top recruiters and helping coach June Jones produce his first two 1,000-yard rushers. In 2011, SMU featured the nation's seventh-leading rusher in Zach Line (122 yds/g and 1,224 yards gained). Following the 2010 season, Klemm was named the top non-BCSAQ Recruiter in the nation by Rivals.com, and was further recognized by the outlet as one of the top 25 recruiters in the country overall. Other services took note as well, as FoxSports/Scout.com named him the Conference USA Recruiter of the Year. Following this success, Klemm was named SMU's Recruiting Coordinator in the summer of 2011.

On the field in 2010, Klemm tutored a young SMU line and guided tackle Kelvin Beachum to first-team all-conference honors. He also led J.T. Brooks and Blake McJunkin to honorable mention All-Conference-USA accolades. His line paved the way for an SMU offense which set school records in total offense, passing yards, passing TDs and first downs among others. Line finished the season with 1,494 yards rushing, the second-best single-season total in school history, trailing only Eric Dickerson's 1982 effort.

In the 2009 season at SMU, Klemm helped Beachum earn All-Conference honors and Brooks and Josh LeRibeus to honorable mention All-Conference accolades. The offense passed for a then-school record 3,666 yards and produced the first collegiate 1,000-yard rusher under June Jones.

Klemm was the 46th overall selection in the 2000 NFL Draft after a standout career at Hawai'i. He played under coach Jones during his senior season (1999), and was a part of the biggest turnaround in NCAA football history, as Hawai'i improved from 0-12 to 9-4 and won a bowl game that season. Following that success, Klemm was selected as the starting left tackle at the Senior Bowl and also received invitations to the Hula Bowl and the East-West Shrine Game. He attended St. Monica High School in Santa Monica, CA.

Demetrice Martin (Michigan St./ Excelsior College '06) - Passing Game Coordinator/Defensive Backs

Demetrice Martin was named to Coach Mora's UCLA staff in December of 2011. He left a position as the secondary/cornerbacks coach at the University of Washington to join the Bruins. He had been on the UW staff for three seasons and had helped the 2010 Husky secondary finish second in the Pac-10 in pass defense.

Prior to his assignment with Washington, Martin was an assistant at Mt. San Antonio College in Walnut, CA and helped the Mounties to a 12-2 record and a trip to the state title game.

In 2007 and 2008, he was a defensive graduate assistant at USC, working with the Trojan secondary. Prior to working on the USC staff, he spent three seasons as the pass defense coordinator at Mt. SAC. He was also the secondary coach at Pasadena CC in 2001 and 2002 and began his career in coaching at Monrovia, CA High School (1999-2000).

A product of Pasadena, CA Muir High School, Martin went to Michigan State, where he played wide receiver and cornerback from 1992 to 1995, earning first-team All-Big Ten honors in 1994 as a defensive back. He went on to play cornerback for the Scottish Claymores in NFL Europe and for the Houston Thunderbears in the Arena Football League. He signed as a free agent with the St. Louis Rams in the NFL.

Angus McClure (Sacramento State '95) - Defensive Line/Recruiting Coordinator

Angus McClure is starting his 20th year coaching football and his sixth season as a member of the Bruin staff. This year he is directing the defensive line, having previously coached the tight ends, offensive line and special teams since arriving in Westwood in 2007. Angus continues in his role as the Recruiting Coordinator. Over the past four years, McClure has led the recruiting effort which has resulted in Bruin classes being ranked among the nation's top 20 in each year.

Last year, UCLA led the South Division of the Pac-12 in rushing and played in the inaugural Pac-12 Championship Game. Over his time as a Bruin coach, McClure tutored a number of current NFL players: Logan Paulsen (Washington Redskins), Matt Slater (New England Patriots), Kai Forbath (Dallas Cowboys) and Christian Yount (Cleveland Browns).

McClure came to UCLA after serving as the offensive line/run game coordinator on Turner Gill's staff at the University of Buffalo during the 2006 season. Buffalo scored more points (201) in conference games than any other team in the Mid-American Conference East Division. Running back James Starks (starter for the 2011 Green Bay Packers' Super Bowl Championship team) earned second-team All-MAC honors in 2006 and was an honorable mention Freshman All-American by The Sporting News. Offensive lineman Jamie Richard was drafted and became a starter for the Indianapolis Colts.

McClure spent the 2004 and 2005 seasons as an assistant on Bill Callahan's staff at Nebraska. He assisted with the offensive line, coaching the tackles, as well as working with the special teams. The Cornhuskers defeated Michigan in the 2005 Alamo Bowl. As a Husker coach, McClure tutored a number of NFL players: Matt Slauson (NY Jets), Lydon Murtha (Miami Dolphins), Chris Patrick (NY Giants), and Sam Koch (Baltimore Ravens).

Prior to his stint at Nebraska, McClure played a major role in some record-breaking offenses at Sacramento State University, where he was assistant head coach and offensive line coach from 1997-2003. During his tenure at Sacramento State, the Hornets set 52 NCAA Division I-AA, Big Sky Conference or school records. He coached 20 All-Big Sky conference honorees and had six of his players sign NFL contracts. One of McClure's pupils, Lonie Paxton (New England Patriots and Denver Broncos) went on to collect three Super Bowl rings. Another McClure offensive lineman, Marco Cavka was drafted by the New York Jets. In addition, five Sacramento State players earned All-American honors and four were chosen to participate in college all-star games. In his seven seasons at Sac State, the Hornets led the Big Sky in rushing four times.

In 1996, McClure coached the tight ends at the University of Nevada. He helped the Wolf Pack to the Big West title, a 9-3 record and the Las Vegas Bowl championship. His tight ends produced a school record 13 touchdowns during the season. Nevada led Division I-A with 527 yards per game of total offense and topped the Big West Conference in both rushing and passing.

Angus has served as a guest coach in several NFL camps over the years, including the Buffalo Bills, San Francisco 49ers, Seattle Seahawks and San Diego Chargers.

A graduate of Sacramento State where he played football from 1987-91, McClure also served as a member of the faculty from 1997-2004. He was on the 1988 Hornet team that advanced to the NCAA Division II championship semifinals with an offense averaging 486 yards per game. He began his coaching career at McClatchy High School in Sacramento as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator from 1992-95.

Angus and his wife, Erin, have two sons, Hamish (13) and Malcolm (8).

Marques Tuiasosopo (Washington '01) - Tight Ends

Tuiasosopo (TWO-ee-ah-so-SO-po) is set to begin his first season as a collegiate coach and will work with the UCLA tight ends. He was a coaching intern with the Bruin program in 2011 before being elevated to a full-time position, as quarterbacks coach, for the UCLA bowl game.

An outstanding quarterback at the University of Washington, Tuiasosopo became the first player in NCAA history to pass for over 300 yards (302) and run for 200 more (207) in a 1999 game versus Stanford. He led the Huskies to the 2000 Pac-10 title and a trip to the 2001 Rose Bowl game. Washington defeated Purdue, 34-24, in the New Year's Classic and Tuiasosopo was named the Rose Bowl Player of the Game. He finished eighth in the voting for the 2000 Heisman Trophy. Tuiasosopo was also selected as the Pac-10 Conference's Offensive Player of the Year and as the league's first-team all-conference quarterback.

Tuiasosopo served as team captain of the Huskies for both his senior and junior seasons and started 27 games over his collegiate career. By the time his playing days were over, he owned the University of Washington school record for total offense. In the course of his UW career, he compiled 1,495 rushing yards, 21 rushing touchdowns and passed for 5,879 yards and 33 touchdowns. Tuiasosopo was a second-team All-Pac-10 pick in his junior season and a multiple year honorable mention all-conference academic team selection. In 1997, he became the first true freshman to start a game at quarterback for UW (vs. Oregon).

Tuiasosopo went on to be selected in the second round of the 2001 NFL draft by the Oakland Raiders and played in the NFL for eight seasons. He spent seven seasons with the Raiders (2001-2006, 2008) and one with the New York Jets (2007). He appeared in 13 games with the Raiders over the years, while backing up Rich Gannon, Kerry Collins and Aaron Brooks.

Also a standout on the baseball field, Marques was selected in the 28th round of the 1997 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft by the Minnesota Twins. His dad, Manu, was a defensive lineman at UCLA, who earned first-team all-conference honors in 1976-78. Manu went on to play in the NFL for the Seattle Seahawks and the San Francisco 49ers. His family's ties to UCLA also include cousins Terry and John Tautolo, who each played football at UCLA and in the NFL.

Marques and his wife, Lisa, have two sons, Brayden (3) and Bryce (2), with a daughter due in June.

Jeff Ulbrich (Hawai'i) - Special Team Coordinator / Linebackers

Jeff Ulbrich (UL-brick) joined the UCLA staff in January, 2012 after a playing and coaching career in the NFL. He was on staff with the Seattle Seahawks the past two seasons as a special teams assistant.

In 2010, Seahawks kicker Olindo Mare matched the league's sixth-longest field goal streak with 30 straight. The kickoff return units ranked third in the NFL and the kickoff cover group ranked fifth in the league.

A linebacker as a player, Ulbrich was drafted out of the University of Hawai'i by the San Francisco 49ers in the third round (86th pick overall) of the 2000 NFL Draft. He won a starting linebacker job with the 49ers in 2001 and was on the team for 10 seasons, playing for head coaches Steve Mariucci, Dennis Erickson, Mike Nolan and Mike Singletary. In 2007, Ulbrich took a backup role to first-round pick Patrick Willis, and also had an impact on special teams. He was placed on injured reserve in October, 2009 and decided to end his playing career. Ulbrich was hired by the Seattle Seahawks as a special teams assistant on January 29, 2010.

Ulbrich attended junior college and went on to become a two-year starter at the University of Hawai'i. He earned All-Western Athletics Conference first-team honors at middle linebacker and was a team co-captain as a senior. He led the conference with a school season record 169 tackles that year, setting a University of Hawai'i record with 127 assisted tackles. He ranked third in the league with eight sacks for 67 yards and totaled 15 tackles for loss (minus 58 yards) and made two interceptions. In his junior season, he finished with 41 tackles, including a sack.

Jeff and his wife, Cristina, have three children, Sammy (11), Jax (8) and Jace (6).

Eric Yarber (Idaho '95) - Wide Receivers

Eric Yarber joined the Bruin staff in Jan. of 2012 after two seasons with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers which was his fifth season overall in the NFL. In 2011, he worked as the wide receivers coach for a promising young unit that included the development of second-round pick Arrelious Benn and fourth-round pick Mike Williams.

Under Yarber's direction, Williams turned in one of the top seasons by a receiver in Buccaneers history, recording 65 receptions for 964 yards and 11 touchdowns. He led all rookie receivers in each of these categories, earning The Sporting News and PFW/PFWA All-Rookie Team selection while finishing second in the voting for the Associated Press Offensive Rookie of the Year Award. Yarber also oversaw the emergence of Benn, who was becoming an important part of the Tampa Bay offense prior to a season-ending knee injury in Week 13.

Yarber came to Tampa Bay after spending three seasons (2007-09) on the collegiate level as the wide receivers coach at Arizona State. While at ASU in 2009, Yarber coached two standout wide receivers in Kyle Williams and Chris McGaha. Williams finished the 2009 campaign with 815 receiving yards on 57 catches and eight scores before being a sixth-round draft pick of the San Francisco 49ers in the 2010 NFL Draft. McGaha racked up 56 catches for 673 yards and four touchdowns on his way to second-team All-Pac-10 honors.

Prior to his work with the Sun Devils, Yarber coached wide receivers for two seasons (2005-06) under head coach Tyrone Willingham at the University of Washington. With Yarber's assistance, receivers Sonny Shackelford and Anthony Russo, turned in strong performances. Russo finished third in the Pacific-10 Conference with a 17.3 yards-per-catch average and Shackelford was fourth in touchdown catches (seven), eighth in receptions (50) and receiving yards (666).

During the 2003-04 seasons, Yarber coached the San Francisco 49ers' wide receivers, and in his first year guided Pro Bowler Terrell Owens to a 1,000-yard season. During this time, Yarber was also instrumental in the development of wide receivers Cedrick Wilson and Brandon Lloyd, as the duo ranked first and second among 49ers' receivers in yards after the catch, with 13.6 and 13.1 averages (min. 10 receptions), respectively, in 2004.

From 1999-2002, Yarber coached at Oregon State, where he worked with the running backs for one season (1999) before switching to wide receivers (2000-2002). His efforts with receivers Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh led to the pair being selected in the second and seventh rounds, respectively, by the Cincinnati Bengals in the 2001 NFL Draft.

Yarber coached his first year in the NFL in 1998, working as an offensive quality control coach with the Seattle Seahawks. He spent the 1997 season coaching receivers at UNLV. He began his coaching career in 1996 when he took a job as the secondary coach at his alma mater, Idaho.

Yarber was selected by the Washington Redskins as a 12th-round pick in the 1986 NFL Draft and played three seasons as a wide receiver and punt returner. He was part of the Redskins squad that defeated the Denver Broncos in Super Bowl XXII in 1988, leading that team with 37 punt returns. At Idaho, Yarber was a Kodak All-American and the Big Sky Conference's Most Valuable Player during his senior year, catching 75 passes for 1,103 yards. As a junior, he finished 10th in the nation in punt returns and third in the conference with 817 receiving yards on 54 catches. He attended Crenshaw High School in Los Angeles.

Coaching Staff

Sal Alosi (Hofstra '01) - Strength and Conditioning Coordinator

Sal Alosi, who has both collegiate and NFL experience, was hired on Jan. 10, 2012 to be UCLA's strength and conditioning coordinator for football. He comes to the Bruins after serving as the head strength and conditioning coach at Bryant University (Rhode Island) in 2011, where he worked with all 22 of the Bulldogs' varsity programs. Alosi's skill and knowledge in the weight room played a vital role in the development of the Bryant athletic department in its final year of transition to full Division I status.

Prior to working at Bryant, Alosi spent nine years in the NFL, where he served as the head strength and conditioning coach for both the New York Jets and the Atlanta Falcons.

A four-year letterwinner and linebacker at Hofstra University, Alosi led the Pride to back-to-back Division I-AA (now FCS) quarterfinal playoff appearances in 1999 and 2000 and topped the team in tackles as a senior.

Following his playing career, he joined the coaching staff at his alma mater, becoming an assistant strength and conditioning coach at Hofstra in 2001, when the Pride won its first Atlantic 10 Conference title in football, advancing to the Division I-AA playoffs for the third-straight year.

Alosi went on to join the NFL's New York Jets a season later and stayed there until the 2006 campaign, when he was hired by the Atlanta Falcons to direct the team's strength and conditioning program under head coach Jim Mora. After one season with the Falcons, though, Alosi returned to New York on Feb. 21, 2007 as the Jets' head strength and conditioning coach and was on the same staff as Bruin offensive coordinator Noel Mazzone.

A native of Massapequa, N.Y., Alosi graduated from Hofstra University with a degree in exercise science.

Marcus Patton (Kansas State '04) - Graduate Assistant - Defense

Marcus Patton is in his second season as UCLA's defensive graduate assistant coach. His duties include assisting the defensive coaches with game preparation and working with the cornerbacks.

Patton, who played football at Kansas State University, joined the Bruin staff after working in 2010 as the defensive graduate assistant at the University of South Florida under head coach Skip Holtz. At USF, he worked with the defensive backs, assisted with the scheme and defensive game plan, assisted with recruiting and special teams and ran the special teams and offensive scout teams during practices. The squad posted an 8-5 record, including a win over Clemson in the Meineke Car Care Bowl.

Prior to that assignment, Patton was employed as a teacher and football coach at Lakeland, FL High School from 2007-2010. He tutored the defensive backs and helped the Dreadnaughts win three state championships and two national championships. In 2006, Patton worked as a teacher and football coach at Miami, FL Senior High School. He served as the defensive coordinator and coached the defensive line and the running backs. In 2005, Patton worked as a teacher and football coach at Port St. Lucie, FL High School. He was defensive coordinator and coached the linebackers and quarterbacks. In 2004, Patton was a teacher and football coach at Clayton High School in St. Louis, MO. He worked with the defensive backs and receivers and was the assistant defensive coordinator. The Clayton defense led the St. Louis area in interceptions and forced turnovers that season and captured the 2004 Class 4 Missouri state championship.

Patton played college football at Kansas State from 2001-04 and earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Social Science in December of 2004. He was a member of the 2003 Big 12 Championship team which defeated Oklahoma in the conference championship game to earn the Wildcat's first conference football title since 1934. In 2002, he was a Purple Pride Award winner. Marcus was listed on the Big 12 Academic Honor Roll for two semesters. He transferred to KSU after playing one season at Southeast Missouri State in 2000 and redshirted in 2001 at K-State. An all-state performer as a running back and defensive back at Jennings High School in St. Louis, MO, Patton rushed for over 2,000 yards in his prep career.

Patrick Girardi (Columbia '03) - Director of On-Campus Recruiting

Patrick Girardi is set to begin his fifth season as a member of the Bruin staff and his second as Director of On-Campus Recruiting for football. In his present position, Girardi's duties include recruiting administration and organization; current roster and scholarship management, managing all official and unofficial visits; tracking all recruiting paperwork, including transcripts, serving as liaison to college All-Star game representatives; liaison with pro scouts; and other assignments from the head coach.

He served in the 2009 and 2010 seasons as an intern under the Director of On-Campus Recruiting. In April of 2008, Girardi joined the staff and worked as an offensive intern. He assisted the offensive line coach, assembled and drew weekly game playbooks, broke down game film and composed self-scout reports. Also, he assisted and helped organize recruiting efforts in Southern and Northern California.

Girardi began his coaching career as a varsity assistant at Los Angeles' Loyola High School in 2006-2007. In 2007, he tutored the offensive line and in 2006, he coached the defensive line. Girardi, who played college football at Columbia, continued his playing career in the Arena 2 Football League. He played on both the offensive line and defensive line for the Tri-Cities Fever in 2006. He had previously played on both lines for the San Diego Riptide in 2004.

Pat was an All-Ivy League selection as an offensive lineman at Columbia in 2002. He was also a team captain that season. A three-year starter, he played from 1999-2002. Girardi attended Loyola High School in Los Angeles and was named a 1999 first-team All-Del Rey League performer as an offensive lineman. He received a National Football Foundation College Hall of Fame Scholar Athlete award.

Will Peddie (UCLA '06) - Director of Football Operations

Will Peddie, a former member of the Bruin football team, is in this third season on the staff. He will begin his new role as Director of Football Operations this spring.

In 2011, Peddie worked as the Director of Player Development after serving as the Player Development Intern in 2010. His duties included monitoring all academic services, community outreach, coordinating off-season jobs and internships, serving as the football liaison with the Dean of Students as well as with the Office of Residential Life. In 2009, he was the defensive line coach and strength and conditioning coach at Santa Fe Christian High School in Solana Beach, CA. He also spent time as a Speed and Strength Specialist with Play Fast Athletics while in San Diego. In 2008, he volunteered with head coach Chuck Long's staff at San Diego State University as a Defensive Assistant, working under Defensive Coordinator Bob Elliot.

Peddie, a tight end, redshirted on the 2002 UCLA football squad. He then played that position for three years prior to switching to defensive line as a senior in 2006. Will, who is married to the former Jenny Greene, grew up in La Jolla, CA and attended La Jolla Senior High in San Diego (CA).
